1	Parent's passport or national ID, child's birth certificate (original and photocopy).	
2	Notarized power of attorney for the child (if the caregiver is not a parent).	
3	Referral for hospitalization and scheduled hospitalization voucher (talon)

5	Immunization/vaccination record data (copy).	
6	Certificate of epidemiological environment / absence of contact with infectious diseases	Up to 10 days

****Pursuant to Order No. KP-ДCM-111 of the Ministry of Healthcare of the Republic of Kazakhstan dated 5 October 2022, “On Approval of the Sanitary Rules ‘Sanitary and Epidemiological Requirements for the Organization and Implementation of Sanitary and Anti-Epidemic and Sanitary Preventive Measures for the Prevention of Acute Intestinal Infections’,” Appendix 1, paragraph 26, was amended to include the additional provision set out in paragraph 7.1.**

Notes: The child and the accompanying person must have season-appropriate clothing, a change of non-slip footwear with closed heels, sufficient changes of underwear, face masks, a name badge, and sportswear. The child must also have swimwear and, where applicable, swim diapers, a swimming cap and goggles. Personal hygiene items must be brought, including soap, a toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, and other necessary toiletries. A wheelchair or stroller should be brought if required.

Textbooks for primary school Grades 1–4 must also be brought.
